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ii V I Piano Voicings

Knowing these voicings in the context of a ii-V-I progression is important for jazz pianists when they are soloing or playing the melody. The "Expansion Technique" These left-hand voicings can also be turned into two-hand comp voicing. All you have to do is move the second from the bottom note up an octave in each voicing.



These voicing works really well for II-V-I progressions, because you only need to change a few notes (and by only a small interval) to move from one chord to the next (i.e. there is smooth voice leading). Below is an example of a II-V-I in the key of C using rootless chord voicings. Notice how smoothly each chord transitions to the next.
